

Northwest Missouri State University Board of Regents Open Meeting Minutes January 26, 2018, 10 a.m.

The Northwest Missouri State University Board of Regents met at 10 a.m. on January 26, 2018 in the Northwest Missouri State University Boardroom of the J.W. Jones Student Union pursuant to public notice given January 18, 2018.
