@ Student must have a minimum ACT of 21, a 2.5 GPA in all areas and scores of 265 or above on the C-Base to be admitted to the teacher education program. Application must be done after the completion of 45 hours, which must include the general education core (marked @ above) a minimum of one full trimester prior to student teaching.

** Fine Arts credits must come from department numbers 13, 19, 22 or 43.

Students must earn at least 124 academic hours and have at least a 2.5 GPA in education, professional education and agriculture courses, a passing score on the PRAXIS exam, and 2,000 hours of agricultural occupational experience after the age of 14 to receive a B.S. in Education Degree in Agricultural Education.
