Beginning in 1997, the Statewide Cooperative EdD Program was designed to fulfill the needs of PK-12 and postsecondary education leaders across the state.

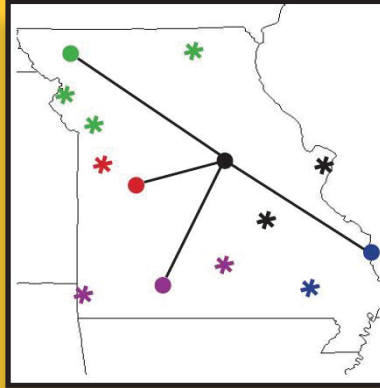
The EdD is an advanced degree in educational leadership for a variety of executive leadership positions in public and private education and related fields.
