## **II. Committee Reports:**

Ila. Academic Petitions (Mike Miller, Chair) - no report

IIb. Academic Appeals (Ajay Bandi, Chair) – met Feb. 3 to hear two appeals

- Ilc. Curriculum and Degree Requirements (Trevor Meyer, Chair) new curriculum management is functionally the same but has a new look
- Ild. Designated Curriculum Matters (Bill Richardson, Chair) no report
- Ile. Assessment (Robert Voss, Chair) Feb. 20 issuance of Course Tune and Catalyst Software (purchased for OP; we were previously working on a trial version and it is currently under consideration for contract) connects (tracks) assignment and outcomes all OP assignments may soon be linked to a particular outcome. It is unclear how this will be integrated or how it will affect non-OP classes. McBride asked to meet with Provost's Council to review outcomes. Chairs and Directors want to have oversight on programme outcomes but this is a concern because outcomes were not intended to be an evaluation tool for faculty (so a concern from a faculty welfare and assessment perspective). Also, this would take outcomes out of the hands of faculty. Especially problematic if new or adjunct faculty responsible for outcomes that were previously erroneous or if outcome data/parameters faulty).
- Ilf. Faculty Welfare, Budget, and Finance (Linda Smith, Chair) committee is currently working on grievance policy (next meeting April 6)
- Ilg. Teaching and Learning (Sue Myllykangas, Chair) committee is still looking at statement for the sharing of academic information and protections for on-line courses. Statement probably belongs in employment contract rather than in by-laws/Chapter 2. Discussion of Lockdown Browser issues if someone gets the blue screen of death, suggest switching from Chrome to Firefox, updating browser and/or Lockdown Browser, and ensuring phones + i-watches are on airplane mode
- Ilh. Legislative Committee (ad hoc) (Brett Chloupek, Chair) looking at creating a dashboard to track bills relevant to higher education. A Senator suggested adding a "Richter scale" of "badness" would be a good addition
- Ili. Institutional Review Board (Machelle Skinner, Chair) no report

### IV. Items From the Floor:

 One Senator asked for update on the Missouri Association of Faculty Senates (MAFS). Beemer reported attending a meeting, but that it was disorganized and very poorly attended

- One Senator raised concern that initiatives from Faculty Senate and its committees often do not succeed because the administration tends to use delay tactics to "wait Faculty Senate out" for a change in leadership and membership. Discussion. Two suggestions to help alleviate this problem:
  - 1. Add reminders to communications with Administration to indicate/recap progress to date (e.g., "last we met, we decided...")
  - 2. Add a statement within the By-Laws to have previous year's Faculty Senate Committee Chairs/Directors/Leaders be added as ex officio, non-voting members of new committees
  - Adam noted that Atlantica Hope, a mass-casualty exercise similar to Missouri Hope, will take place March 31-April 2 and that flyers/calls for volunteers would follow soon
