 - O Human Resources Krista Barcus Continued emailed correspondence to the state re:blue book and printing "something" but the website was not updated; We sent our information to them in April with the knowledge it should be published by the "first of the year" but which year (fiscal, academic, calendar) was not specified by the state; We asked about the website information being updated but nothing from the state; no other university's is updated across the state; Staff council chair notified too; will share info as necessary;
 - open enrollment completed and updated; 94% insurance completed; more employees participated in physicians screening; employee engagement survey results to NLT on Dec 19, action plans will come out in early spring; December 12 recognition lunch; Compensation study update: looking at adjunct, overload and summer pay; getting us up to speed with others;
 - Questions: Blue Book information- can we post it ourselves? Maybe no law against it, but maybe we can post our own information? It would be more individual, but should we share it internally? Senate recommended it to be shared at least internally for MyNorthwest; The BlueBooks have not been updated for the previous three years;

- Ozoom request discussion There are general questions of how to include people in our Senate meetings who are online; each department runs online participation separately with no standards; For our purposes as a Senate, we have language that requires attendance, but there remains the question: What does "attend" mean in our bylaws today? How do we include fully online faculty in Senate moving forward?
 - Small committees and work groups might be online, but Senate is in person especially with reports from administrators; sometimes with circumstances with no alternates it might need to be in Zoom; quorum rules might apply as well; alternates might need the "onboarding" experiences for future involvement in Senate;
 - We are still on board with our alternates being used; the regular member can join via zoom but will be the non-voting member; voting will be done by the member in-person
 - Zoom links will be available for the public to join;

 - a. A question was asked about who determined the formation of the Professional Development Days and who selected which presentation and also about Professional Development in general. The question was answered with a general response that the Learning and Teaching Center is responsible overall, but Dr. Gail Cullen and Dr. Brooke Macatee together were working on the selections for the Professional Development Day.
