- Call to Order
 - o President Beemer called the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m.
- Approval of Agenda
 - o Motion to approve Senator Bradley/Second by Senator Miller The agenda was approved.
- Approval of Minutes
 - **Motion to approve Senator Ford /Second by Senator Wilson** The minutes were approved with one abstention.
- Reports:
 - o Provost Report (Dr. Hooyman)
 - No report
 - o Human Resources (Krista Barcus)
 - Ms. Barcus reported that the immigration attorney was on campus to meet with foreign national employees with international visa status as part of an annual legal process provided by HR.
 - Employee engagement surveys are available as part of the dashboard. After the data has been shared with departments task sheets and goals are to be returned to HR. Anyone with questions can contact Dr. Beemer or HR.
 - Wellness initiatives are underway including Move Spring and the Wondr program.
 - NLT is still reviewing the compensation study.

o Academic Petitions (Dr. Miller)

 Senator Miller reported that the committee has not met since the last meeting, but will meet during Spring Break.

o Academic Appeals (Dr. Greenidge)

Senator Greenidge reported that there are no current appeals. The committee met on March 4 to discuss bylaw changes. Dr. Kori Hoffman attended the meeting to provide input. The committee will vote on proposed additions during the week of March 18.

o CDR (Dr. Meyer)

- Senator Meyer reported that the committee met and reviewed 9 proposals.
- Senator Meyer indicated that work is being done on a 'mini primer' for the proposal process and the fully comprehensive guide will also be revised.
- There is a possible move to a new curriculum management system. Senator Meyer will work to continue to report on the status of potential adoption.
- Senator Meyer met with chairs and directors and had a good discussion about the procedures and process roles of CDR. A discussion of 'impacted units' yielded a reminder that any proposal that might impact a unit is routed through that department.

 Senator Meyer indicated that he would recommend that representation from each unit is part of the makeup of the CDR committee.

o DCM (Dr. Hill)

o Assessment (Dr. Fellah)

- Senator Fellah reported that the committee met and discussed reviewing the annual faculty evaluation process. The committee will be reviewing the form and will make recommendations to address duplications, guidance, and other issues. If there are suggestions that individuals have they can contact Senator Fellah.
- The committee also discussed learning outcomes and the ways that faculty get the results from learning outcomes. Dr. Mike McBride can give data from the outcomes.
- The committee discussed the grading scheme and whether or not the system in place is good for students or if it needs to be improved.
- Graduate students are concerned about the impact of the evaluation on their grades. Some graduate students feel as though their grades will be impacted by the evaluation that they give their professors. There is a move to have a seminar for graduate students (undergraduate students would also be welcome) to help them understand the process as the evaluation system used here is not used in other countries and is new to some students who are not familiar with the process of evaluating professors.
- Clarifying the expectation for course load. Inconsistencies have been noted between workloads in courses.
- The committee discussed AI and its impact on submissions of homework, etc., and whether or not there will be an AI policy.
- There is an outcome committee that works with Dr. McBride.
 The committee would like to know how individuals are chosen for the outcomes committee for the university.

o Teaching and Learning (Dr. Gallaher)

- Senator Gallaher reported that the committee will be reviewing the grant applications for the teaching and learning grants.
- The Distinguished Lecture Series lecture was this week.
- A discussion of the compensation structure for the revision of online courses and the equity issues that surround this structure ensued.

• Senator Ford reported that the committee has not met since the last meeting. The committee will meet again on April 8.

o Legislative (Dr. Chloupek)

- Senator Chloupek reported that the legislative update is available on the Faculty Senate Canvas site.
- Senator Chloupek reported on the bill to change Core 42 to Core 60 and the issues that could surround that change. There are many issues and confusing language in the current bill.
- o COTE, Staff Council, Graduate Council, Research, IRB, Animal Welfare, University Seminar
 - Senator Wall shared that there has been a change to the requirements for education majors. Those majors may have the opportunity to take the Assessment of Core Proficiencies that all other students take. The education majors would no longer have to pay to take the test.
