CLASS C VIOLATIONS ACCORDING TO THE UNIVERSITY JUDICIAL CODE

1. Sexual misconduct
2. Use, possession or distribution of any controlled substances
3. Possession or in the presence of drug paraphernalia
4. Any form of theft or stealing
5. Possession of a weapon
6. Possession of fireworks
7. Destruction of campus property
8. Endangering the health or safety of self or others
9. Inappropriate, disruptive or abusive behavior
10. Striking another person
11. Lying to University officials
12. Harassing witnesses or committee members
13. Violation of University Policies, city ordinances and/or state and federal laws
14. Violation of Campus Conduct or Strict Campus Conduct probation
15. Tampering with fire alarms
16. Discrimination
17. Consumption/possession of alcohol (2nd offense)
18. Failure to comply with the directives of a campus official
19. Misuse/abuse of University computing system
20. Hazing
21. Theft of telephone communication services
22. Cohabitation (2nd offense)

Hearing Committees

Mediation (Panhellenic Council Only)

All Panhellenic Council violations will first be heard through the mediation process. The Associate Vice President of Student Affairs will serve as the Mediator. The campus Greek Advisor and Panhellenic Vice President of Judicial Affairs will serve only as an observer, unless filing violation charges. Should the two parties be unable to mediate, the case will be moved to the Panhellenic Judicial Board.

Interfraternity Council & Panhellenic Council Judicial Boards

Each respective organization facilitates the selection of j-boards members. The chair of each board is designated as the Vice President of Judicial Affairs through the Executive Board election process for each organization. The council j-boards will hear cases involving council violations. Each council's Executive Board will hear all appeals resulting from decisions made by the j-board. All appeals decisions by the council's Executive Board will be final.

Class C Violations

Class C Violations involving student organizations will be reported directly to the Assistant Vice President and/or Vice President of Student Affairs for appropriate adjudication or action.
