Chapter Campus Safety

Section Parking Areas

I. Purpose

The goal of the University Traffic Advisory Committee is to provide high quality parking and traffic services within an ever-changing campus environment.

II. Policy

1. Resident parking is restricted 24 hours a day and a resident parking permit shall be required.
2. Resident student parking is permitted only in areas designated as “resident student parking”. A resident permit is required in these areas. A resident student is defined as a student who is assigned to University housing.
3. Commuter student parking is permitted only in areas designated for “commuter student parking”. A displayed commuter permit is required in these areas. A commuter student is defined as a student who resides off campus and commutes to the University for classes.
4. Faculty and Staff parking is permitted only in areas designated as “faculty and staff parking”. A faculty/staff permit is required in these areas.
5. Only vehicles with a state issued handicap license plate or hangtag shall park in designated handicap spaces.
6. Visitor parking is designated for visitors only. Any vehicle with a permit displayed shall not park in visitor parking and shall be subject to receipt of a citation for parking in an area designated for others.
7. *If a Northwest student who resides in University housing is a member of the immediate family of a Northwest employee with a faculty/staff permit, he/she may not park that registered vehicle in resident student areas.*
8. No vehicle shall display more than one current parking permit.
9. Spaces that are specially designated by a sign will be used only by those designated people. These areas shall be reserved 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
