Target Audience: K-12 Teachers, All Content Areas, Administrators

Teacher Outcomes:

- Awareness Level:
 - Develop an understanding of research based instruction
 - Develop an understanding of research based measurements and interventions
 - Develop an understanding of a Tiered Process of Intervention
- Skill Level:
 - Know how to use and interpret assessment to monitor student progress
 - Know the process of Tiered Interventions
 - Align students needs to appropriate interventions
- Implementation Level:
 - Uses learning targets and high quality interventions as a response to low achieving students
 - Uses curriculum based measurements to collect individual student data and plan instruction
 - Effectively monitors progress to meet the needs of various learners during instruction
