- Aug 1, 1984 Dr. Dean L. Hubbard becomes Northwest president.
- Aug 1, 2010 Northwest becomes a smoke-free campus.
- Aug 2, 1991 University buildings become smoke-free
- Aug 4, 1948 The Bell of '48, a gift from the class of 1948, is rung for the first time
- Aug 9, 1910 A window shade committee is appointed to select shades for the new Administration Building.
- Aug 18, 2011 A powerful storm carrying heavy rain, hail and 80 mph straight-line winds, causes widespread damage to the campus. It caused power outages, broken windows, water damage, downed tree limbs and roof and siding damage.
- Aug 28, 2000 The Missouri Academy begins with 41 students.
- Aug 28, 2009 The H1N1 influenza outbreak hits Northwest as two students are diagnosed with the flu strain.








COVID19 FEDERAL LEAVE




