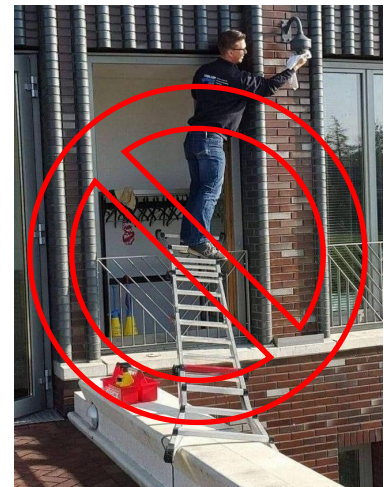

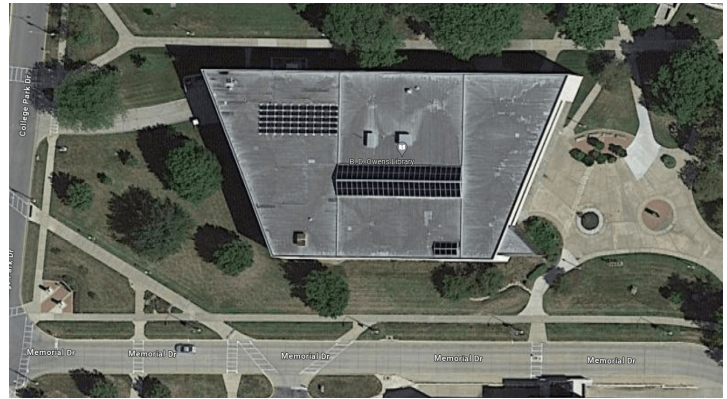
SUSTAINABILITY

Spotlight on Solar

The sun, Earth's most abundant source of energy, is a clean and dependable way to generate power. Solar power emits no carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas that traps heat in the atmosphere and has contributed to accelerated climate change. Using this renewable source of energy also avoids the environmental damage associated with mining or drilling for fossil fuels.

When the sun is shining, solar panels atop the Center for Innovation, Owens Library (shown in the aerial photo), and the Electronic Campus Support Center are absorbing sunlight and converting it into electricity. Together, these three projects have generated 236 megawatt hours (MWh) of electricity. Using solar to generate this electricity eliminated 372,431 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions, or the equivalent of planting of 2,812 trees.

The graph shows the electricity generation from the CI building panels since they were installed in 2021. The months with the longest period of daylight are the most productive, and power generation decreases as the amount of daylight decreases leading up to the winter solstice on December 21.
