player.


Jim is from Barnard, MO. Him and his wife Joyce have twin boys named Ethan and Jacob. For fun, Jim likes to watch them play high school golf.

As we soon start the new FY 22 fiscal year, tackling campus-wide deferred maintenance continues to be one of my top priorities.

We will build on our current momentum. Below are a few examples of what is being planned for FY 22:

First year of an annual phasing of elevator upgrades.

Replacement of the west stairs at Bearcat Arena.

Water infiltration repairs at Hudson-Perrin.

Repairing the roof insulation at the Student Recreation Center.

Replacing the rippled tile flooring at South Complex.

Continued tunnel/steam system repairs.

Continue phased flooring replacements in student rooms with vinyl plank flooring.

Developing a multi-phased plan for addressing underground water lines and valves.

Developing a plan for improved storm water management.

Initiating the first phase of noticeable modernizing of the Central Plant.

Robust repair of walks, streets, and lots.

Responding to safety-related upgrades.

Though we have a long list in front of us, I remain committed to this priority and addressing long-standing deferred repairs in shorter order.


- Independence Day holiday observance (Campus Closed) 7/5

STAFF COUNCIL MEETING

Staff Council met on June 16th. Here are some of the agenda items that were discussed:

Organizational Structure Support & Strategic Operations

Leadership Advisory Team-Clarence Green

- The environmental scan summary was presented at the NLT meeting and at the BOR work session.
- Covid campus mitigation measures are in the process of being unwound.
- The Lamkin roof condition is still a concern, but the rest of the building can be occupied again after a temporary roof repair scheduled for the next three to four weeks. The arena won't be available, but other areas in the building are habitable. A platform may be installed in the Campus Recreation building for use by the varsity basketball and volleyball teams.
- A comprehensive well-being plan was approved at the most recent NLT meeting.
- The university has received \$300,000 in GEAR funds for online education.
- The SafeColleges training modules are being evaluated and input was sought from Staff Council and Faculty Senate when instituting future training.



HEALTH & SAFETY

HEAT-RELATED ILLNESSES WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHAT TO DO **HEAT STROKE** High body temperature (103°F or higher) · Call 911 right away-heat stroke is a medical emergency · Hot, red, dry, or damp skin · Move the person to a cooler place · Fast, strong pulse · Help lower the person's temperature Headache with cool cloths or a cool bath Dizziness · Do not give the person anything to Nausea Confusion · Losing consciousness (passing out) **HEAT EXHAUSTION** · Heavy sweating · Move to a cool place · Cold, pale, and clammy skin · Loosen your clothes Put cool, wet cloths on your body or take a cool bath · Fast, weak pulse · Nausea or vomiting · Sip water · Muscle cramps · Tiredness or weakness Get medical help right away if: Dizziness · You are throwing up Headache · Your symptoms get worse · Fainting (passing out) · Your symptoms last longer than 1 hour **HEAT CRAMPS** Heavy sweating during intense · Stop physical activity and move to a · Muscle pain or spasms · Drink water or a sports drink · Wait for cramps to go away before you do any more physical activity Get medical help right away if: · Cramps last longer than 1 hour · You're on a low-sodium diet · You have heart problems **SUNBURN** · Stay out of the sun until your · Painful, red, and warm skin sunburn heals · Blisters on the skin · Put cool cloths on sunburned areas or take a cool bath · Put moisturizing lotion on sunburned · Do not break blisters **HEAT RASH** Red clusters of small blisters that look · Stay in a cool, dry place like pimples on the skin (usually on the · Keep the rash dry neck, chest, groin, or in elbow creases) · Use powder (like baby powder) to soothe the rash
