## Men's Basketball (13-4, 5-3 MIAA)

- Northwest wraps up the first half of the MIAA season Wednesday vs. Emporia State. The Bearcats travel to Bolivar, Mo., to meet Southwest Baptist Saturday. Both games begin at 7:30 p.m.
- The Hornets have not won in Bearcat Arena since 1997, a streak of 10 games, and have dropped six straight to Northwest.
- Northwest is one game behind conference-leader Southwest Baptist.
- Northwest is leading the league in scoring defense (59.4), scoring margin (+14.1) and rebounding defense (31.9).

## Women's Basketball (11-6, 6-2 MIAA)

- The Bearcats finish the first half of the MIAA season Wednesday vs. No. 16 Emporia State. Northwest heads to Bolivar, Mo., to meet Southwest Baptist Saturday. Both games start at 5:30 p.m.
- Northwest has won five straight against Southwest Baptist, including a 101-97 contest to open the MIAA season.
- The Bearcats are tied for the conference lead with No. 8 Washburn, who lost to Southwest Baptist 66-61 Jan. 22.
- Northwest leads the MIAA in turnover margin (+5.47) and boasts the league's most accurate shooter in Mandi Schumacher (59.1-percent from the field).
- Kelli Nelson set the Northwest 3-point record against Truman Jan. 23, surpassing Laura Friederich's 165 set in 2006. Nelson's scored 168.
