Men's Basketball (13-6, 5-5 MIAA)

- The Bearcats play Emporia State for the second time in eight days on Wednesday at White Auditorium before meeting Central Missouri Saturday at the UCM Multipurpose Building.
- Northwest has won three straight in Emporia, Kan., coming back from a 16-0 deficit last year and winning in double-overtime two years ago.
- The Bearcats are No. 4 in the first NCAA South Central Regional poll released Jan. 30.
- Hunter Henry is 49 points away from becoming the 15th person in Northwest history with 1,000 career points. Henry also needs 26 rebounds to becoming the 10th Bearcat to have 1,000 career points and 500 career rebounds.

Women's Basketball (11-8, 6-4 MIAA)

- Northwest travels to No. 24 Emporia State Wednesday night and to Central Missouri Saturday for a 1:30 p.m. game.
- The Bearcats are No. 10 in the first NCAA South Central Regional poll released Jan. 30.
- Meghan Brue is averaging 18 points in the last three games.
- Northwest is leading the MIAA with 10.63 steals per game and a turnover margin on +5.37.

Men's Indoor Track and Field

- The Bearcats return to the track Friday at the UCM Relays. Competition at the UCM Multipurpose Building starts at 11 a.m.
- Northwest is ranked ninth in the latest USTFCCCA/D2Rankings.com Power Rankings released Jan. 30.
- Sheldon Cook ran a career-best 22.44 200-meter dash at Iowa State Jan. 26, the fourth-fastest time in the MIAA this season.
- Kendall Wright was the top Division II finisher in the long jump at Iowa State, placing fifth with 22-1.75.

Women's Indoor Track and Field

- The Bearcats head to the UCM Relays Thursday. The meet starts at 12:30 p.m. from the UCM Multipurpose Building.
- The 4x400-meter relay team of Audrey Bailey, Hannah Henry, Alissa Miller and Bridget Kleine lead the MIAA with a 4:04.55 recorded at Iowa State Jan. 26 (converted from 4:02.95 due to Iowa State's 300-meter track).
- Anna O'Brien missed provisionally qualifying the mile run, timing a career-best 5:05.62 at Iowa State. She holds the fastest time among all MIAA athletes this season.
