Track and Field

- Northwest competed at the Doane multi-events this past weekend
- Emily Churchman Provisionally qualified in the pentathlon with a career-high point total of 3,614, winning the event
- Johanna Avilez placed third in the pentathlon with 3,084 points
- Seth Staashelm placed ninth in the heptathlon with 4,367
- The Bearcats will compete at Central Missouri this weekend

Men's Basketball (10-10, 5-8 MIAA)

- Northwest upset No. 3 Fort Hays State on Saturday 62-59, the loss was FHSU's first loss against a D-II team
- Elijah Allen averaged 22.5 points and 4.5 rebounds per game last week
- The Bearcats went 22-for-28 from the free-throw line Saturday against Fort Hays State
- Bryston Williams scored five of his nine points on Saturday in the final 1:13 of the game
- Northwest had five players in double-figures in their 87-104 loss to UNO back in December

Women's Basketball (11-9, 7-6 MIAA)

- Gentry Dietz scored a career-high 37 points and pulled down a career-best 16 rebounds on Saturday against FHSU
- The 37 points is the fourth-most in Bearcat Arena history and is tied for the third-most in Northwest history
- Shelly Martin had a career-high and Northwest season best, eight assists in Saturday's win
- Northwest defeated UNO back in December 78-68
- Gabby Curtis, who did not play on Saturday, recorded a career-high 27 points in the win over Nebraska-Omaha

Softball

- Head Coach Ryan Anderson begins his fourth season with Northwest
- Northwest will play its first 28 games on the road this season
- The Bearcats will host their first home game on March 16 against Wayne State
- Northwest is competing at the Drury round-robin tournament this weekend in Springfield
- The Bearcats went 13-38 last season
