

## MINUTES OF THE TELEPHONE CONFERENCE OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS Thursday, April 8, 2010

The Board of Regents of Northwest Missouri State University met by telephone conference at 3:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 8, 2010, after notice was duly given to each member of the Board.

<u>Resolution #8598</u>: A motion was made by Regent Hanks, seconded by Regent Panethiere, to approve the following changes to the curriculum:

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES, History, Humanities, Philosophy, and Political Science

Proposal #209-13-03: Change in Comprehensive Major in Social Science. This major currently is organized into five categories: Core requirements (16 hours), American History (15 hours), World History (12 hours), Political Science (6 hours), and Behavioral Science (3 hours). This proposal:

- Adds 33-301 The Historian's Craft (2 hrs) to the core requirements; this is an existing course.
- <u>Moves</u> 33-484 U.S. Economic System-A Comparative History (3 hrs) <u>from</u> the core requirements <u>to</u> the American History requirements, which would decrease the core requirements by 1 credit hour.
- <u>Reduce</u> electives in the American History requirements <u>from</u> 12 hours of electives <u>to</u> 9 hours of approved electives
- Remove 33-375Latin America (3 cr) from the elective options under the World History category

The net effect of these changes is to reduce the number of hours required for the major from 52 to 51 hours. A roll call vote was taken:
