

Northwest Missouri State University Board of Regents Academic and Student Engagement Committee Open Meeting Minutes July 29, 2025 Approved on December 9, 2025

The Northwest Missouri State University Board of Regents Academic and Student Engagement Committee met in open session via Zoom on July 29, 2025, pursuant to public notice given on July 23, 2025.

The following members of the Academic and Student Engagement Committee were present: Steve Coppinger, Chair Jason Klindt and Debbie Roach. FYI's

President Tatum presented the following FYIs to the committee:

Academic Affairs

 Northwest has dissolved the Northwest Kansas City Center contract and moved from the property. A small office is still being maintained for Northwest Kansas City within North Kansas City.

Athletics

- Season ticket renewals went on sale July 1.
- o Assistant Softball and Assistant Track and Field Coach positions remain open.
- The Bearcat Stadium debt has been retired.

Culture

- o Faculty contracts have been distributed. This is the earliest this has ever been completed.
- o The FY26 Northwest Holiday Schedule was approved and posted on the University Calendar.

Finance & Administration

Governor Kehoe vetoed over \$14 million in additional funding that lawmakers had approved for universities and community colleges, resulting in a 1.5% funding increase instead of the proposed 3%.

- President Tatum sent communication to staff and faculty announcing the State funding reduction, noting that this reduction impacts Northwest's base operating budget.
- o The Cyber Security Grant has been put in place and has increased University security protocols.
- Northwest is heading into heavy usage time for Workday. Several management changes will occur
 which will be communicated during the fall semester.
 - Staff should be reminded to complete their timesheets daily during the transition into Workday.
- The HVAC Project will close the Administration Building for approximately seven months. Vice President Carrick is working with departments to secure office placements.

Student Affairs

- o Andrew Murphy has seven new students this fall for the competitive E-sports team.
- The housing software that was recently implemented did not function as promised and Northwest has cancelled that contract. New software is being implemented currently.
- A new hazing policy will be taken to the BOR in July. Dr. Baker will share the policy with NLT members. Once approved it will be published to the Policy Library on the Northwest website.

University Advancement

- University Advancement completed FY25 ahead of fundraising goals, totaling \$6.4 million.
- Interviews have been conducted, and selection is being made for a campaign counsel firm.
- Dr. Dean L. and Aleta Hubbard Hearth and Fireplace Groundbreaking Ceremony is scheduled for July 9, at the Gaunt House Patio.
 - A dedication of the project will occur on Walk-out Day, October 24.
- o The Coaches Caravan begins July 8 in Council Bluffs. Check out the Bearcat Athletics page for details.
