



**Northwest Missouri State University
Board of Regents
Open Meeting Minutes
December 11, 2025
Approved on March 12, 2026**

The Northwest Missouri State University Board of Regents convened at 1 p.m. on December 11, 2025, in the J.W. Jones Student Union Ballroom on the Northwest Missouri State University campus following public notice issued on December 4, 2025.

The following members of the Board were present: Leisha Barry, Steve Black, Steve Coppinger, Shanda Durbin, Jason Klindt, Debbie Roach, and Mel Tjeerdsma. A quorum being present, Chair Tjeerdsma called the meeting to order at 1:01 p.m. Roll call was taken.
