



**Northwest Missouri State University  
Board of Regents  
April 30, 2026 Open Meeting Minutes  
Approved on June 18, 2026**

The Northwest Missouri State University Board of Regents convened at 1 p.m. on April 30, 2026, in the J.W. Jones Student Union Boardroom on the Northwest Missouri State University campus following public notice issued on April 24, 2026.

The following members of the Board were present: Leisha Barry, Steve Black, Steve Coppinger via Zoom, Shanda Durbin, Jason Klindt, Debbie Roach, and Chair Mel Tjeerdsma. #### **Dr. Lance Tatum, University President**

- Thank you to faculty, staff and students for adapting to changes launched in the last two years.
- Updates on initiatives:
  - Enrollment growth and sustainability – University Marketing and Communication staff are doing creative work to connect with students. There will be challenges in FY28 due to probable decrease in state funding.
  - Center for Rural Health planning continues.
  - Search for Vice President of Student Affairs continues with five semi-finalists.
  - Excited to work with new campus dining vendor, Elixir, who will have a student focus.
  - Congratulations to the Bearcat Steppers received national title for second consecutive year.
  - Discussed comprehensive campaign focus on scholarships and the critical need
  - Garrett Strong labs are completed.
  - Martindale Hall renovation is nearing completion with a ribbon cutting event planned in September.
  - Athletics' fundraising efforts resulting in new stadium turf, video board and some outdoor seating.
  - Employee Compensation Model Phase II will be done in January 2027.
  - Commencement ceremonies scheduled for May 1 and 2. Total number of graduates is 1,659.
