

OVERVIEW:

This agreement is intended to provide students who have earned an **Associate in Arts in Teaching** at North Central Missouri College (NCMC) the opportunity to complete a **Bachelor of Science in Education: Special Education Cross Categorical** at Northwest Missouri State University (Northwest) during the 2023-2024 Academic Catalog. Meeting with an academic advisor is important to ensure students are meeting general education and major requirements.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

Section I: Admissions and Matriculation

- Under the provisions of the Memorandum of Agreement, students who meet published admissions standards will be eligible to matriculate at Northwest (nwmissouri.edu/admissions/transfer/criteria.htm). Additionally, students who meet published scholarship guidelines will be awarded accordingly at Northwest (nwmissouri.edu/finaid/aid/scholarships/transfer.htm).
- School of Education requirements are listed in the Academic Catalog: nwmissouri.edu/academics/catalog/index.htm
- Students selecting a major in the School of Education must complete an overall grade point average identified in the Professional Education Handbook on a 4.00 scale.
- See Professional Education Handbook for which courses require a C or better.
- Care should be exercised in choosing courses to assure a minimum of 40 semester hours in courses numbered above 300. All degrees in education are subject to state requirements which may change at any time due to action of the State Board of Education.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

- Transfer credit from NCMC will be evaluated based on the academic policies section of the Academic Catalog (nwmissouri.edu/academics/catalog/index.htm).
- Credit for courses not listed within this agreement may be reviewed in the Transfer Equivalency System (nwmissouri.edu/admissions/transfer/tes.htm).
- Courses that are non-college level (commonly less than 100 level courses) are not transferable toward a baccalaureate degree.
- Only academic courses with passing letter grades (A, B, C, D) will be accepted for graduation requirements. This information is specified in the Academic Catalog.
