

CAMERON INDOOR STADIUM
MEN'S BASKETBALL ENTRY POLICY
Last Updated: July 29, 2017

Following the best practices established by professional sports leagues and many other colleges and universities across the country, Duke University has implemented additional security measures at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

All Persons are Subject to Screening

All persons – game day staff, ticketed guests, and Duke undergraduate and graduate/professional students – are subject to screening before entering Cameron Indoor Stadium. Walk-through metal detectors will be the primary means of screening. For guests who are unable to utilize a walk-through metal detector, hand-held metal detectors will be used with physical pat-downs as a final alternative option. These security measures are in addition to the bag checks that are currently conducted at the stadium. Any person who does not consent to screening will be denied entry into the stadium.

Screening areas are located outside all entrances to Cameron Indoor Stadium and associated game day spaces, including McClendon Plaza, the Duke Basketball Museum and Athletics Hall of Fame, and Scharf Hall. Tickets or credentials are required to enter all game day areas and should be out and ready to be checked by event staff as guests approach the screening areas.

Prohibited Items

Duke University reserves the right to deny anyone or anything from entering the venue. The following items are prohibited from entering Cameron Indoor Stadium:

- Alcoholic Beverages
- Artificial Noisemakers
- Backpacks & Large Bags
- Balloons, Balls & Frisbees
- Cameras w/Lens Over 4 Inches
- Coolers and Drink Containers (including empty bottles)
- Hazardous Materials
- Illegal Drugs
- Laser Pointers
- Outside Food & Beverages (exception: medical reasons)
- Pets (exception: service animals)
- Selfie Sticks
- Shoes with Wheels
- Video Cameras
- Weapons of any kind (including pocket knives)

Any such items can be discarded prior to entry, returned to personal vehicles, or checked at the Game Day Item Check in Kennedy Tower (excluding alcohol, hazardous materials, outside food & beverages, pets, and weapons). All items checked at Game Day Item Check are subject to search and the owner assumes all risk for checked items.

For the safety of all in attendance, items are not permitted to be left unattended outside of Cameron Indoor Stadium. Unattended items found outside the stadium will be dealt with in a manner deemed appropriate by stadium officials, including but not limited to disposal. Duke University and Duke Athletics are not responsible for loss of any unattended items.

Screening Process

Before proceeding through metal detectors, guests will be asked to remove cell phones, large key rings, cameras, and any large metal objects from their pockets and place them in the provided plastic container for inspection. Guests do NOT need to remove jackets, belts, coins, wallets, watches, jewelry, or shoes. All bags will be visually inspected by event staff at a screening table located alongside each metal detector. Guests will be able to watch their belongings throughout the screening process and will pick them up at the end of the table once they have passed through the metal screening.

If a walk-through metal detector alerts event staff to the presence of items that require further inspection, visitors will be asked to step aside and undergo secondary screening with a hand-held metal detector or physical pat-down. Event staff

will check the area(s) where items were detected and ask guests to display them for inspection. Once cleared, guests will enter the stadium.

Children:

All guests, including children, are subject to screening. Infants and toddlers may be carried through the walk-through metal detectors. Children who are able to walk through will be asked to go through on their own. If the walk-through metal detector alerts event staff for items on a child, secondary screening will occur in the presence of a parent/guardian. Designated Medical/Family Lanes are also available at each entrance for families with small children who opt to be screened with a hand-held metal detector.

Accommodations for Guests with Disabilities:

Guests with disabilities who are willing to utilize walk-through metal detectors are encouraged to do so; however these lanes are not accessible for wheelchairs and other assistive devices. The designated Medical/Family Lanes at each entrance are accessible for all guests with disabilities. Guests will be screened using a hand-held metal detector and/or physical pat-down. Assistive devices will be visually inspected following standard bag search procedures. If a private screening area is requested, guests will be escorted by event staff to the designated location closest to their entrance. Once cleared, guests will enter the stadium.

Accommodations for Guests with Medical Devices:

Guests with medical devices should consult their doctor or device manufacturer if unsure of their ability to utilize a walk-through metal detector. Event staff will not give advice regarding any medical devices. Guests who are unable to use a walk-through metal detector should utilize the Designated Medical/Family Lanes at each entrance. Guests should notify event staff that they have a medical device. Guests who agree to screening with a hand-held metal detector will be asked to place their palm over the area of the device so that it can be avoided during screening. After hand-held metal detector screening is complete, event staff will clear the area of the device using a physical pat-down. A private screening area may be requested and guests will be escorted by event staff to the designated location closest to their entrance. Once cleared, guests will enter the stadium.

Accommodations for Items of Religious and Cultural Significance:

If a metal detector alerts event staff to the presence of items that require further inspection and the guest indicates the item is of religious or cultural significance, guests will be given the option of secondary screening in private. Guests will be escorted by event staff to the designated location closest to their entrance and screened with a hand-held metal detector and/or physical pat-down. While Duke University respects the religious and cultural importance of certain items to our guests, no religious knives, swords or other similar objects will be permitted to enter the stadium.

No Stadium Re-Entry

Once a ticket is scanned for entry at Cameron Indoor Stadium, there is no re-entry once guests exit the game day screening perimeter.
