

# COUNCIL ON TEACHER EDUCATION

## P-12 School Representatives Reports/Updates

Shannon Nolte reported that the APR (report cards for schools) are being released. The schools in the northwest part of Missouri did very well. The ACT test is being administered to high school juniors. The revision of the Missouri Learning Standards (House Bill 1490) are being submitted for approval by the State Board.

Heidi Beatty reported that they are approaching the end of the first quarter. They are also using the new math curriculum and finding some success with it.

Michele Veasey moved to approve the minutes of the September 10, 2015, meeting. The motion was seconded by Dr. Zeliff and unanimously approved.

Dr. Malm moved, seconded by Dr. Wall, to approve the agenda. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Malm moved, seconded by Dr. Zeliff, to approve Proposal 115-62-01, Change in Major, Middle School Education. Pat Thompson explained that this proposal was made due to changes in certification requirements and changes the requirement from two subject areas to one subject required for the Middle School major. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Zeliff moved, seconded by Dr. Wall, to approve Proposal 115-44-05:

- Deletion of Course, 44-344 Desktop Publishing
- Change in Concentration, Middle School Business Education
- Change in Major, Business Education
- Change in Minor, Marketing and Cooperative Education
- Change in Minor, Business Education
- Deletion of Elementary Education Computer Concentration


Dr. Zeliff explained that the changes being made to these programs are due to the changes in certification requirements. The motion was unanimously approved.
