The meeting was called to order by Sarah Creason, Chairperson, with the following members present: Ashley Black, Shantel Farnan, Joseph Haughey, Jackie Lacy, Cheryl Malm, Mike McBride, Taylor Miles, Shannon Nolte, Destiny Plair, Linda Smith, Tim Wall, and Amy Wilson. The following members were absent: Dan Gordon, School of Education; Greg Haddock, Ex Officio for Graduate Studies; Joe Kreizinger, College of Arts and Sciences; Andrea Mason, Horace Mann/Leet Center; Neil Nuttall, Ex Officio for Northwest-Kansas City; Greg Rich, School of Education; and Rena' Smith, College of Arts and Sciences.

P-12 School Representatives Reports/Updates

Shannon Nolte reported that he is apprising superintendents in northwest Missouri about COTE activities. This group of superintendents is interested in collaboration with the NW School of Education. There is a pilot assessment partnership in Missouri for a formative assessment. This is a push towards more formative assessments. This may eventually replace the MAP tests.

Dr. Haughey moved to approve the minutes of the March 8, 2018, meeting. The motion was seconded by Dr. Black and unanimously approved.

Dr. Haughey moved to approve the agenda with the addition of Proposals 218-CDR-04 and 218-CDR-06 and moving Agenda Items 13 and 14 to the beginning of the agenda. The motion was seconded by Dr. Farnan and unanimously approved.

Dr. Smith moved, seconded by Dr. Farnan, to approve the Change in Admission Requirements to the Teacher Education Program. Dr. Malm explained that the admission requirements were changed to reflect the redesigned education programs. The major changes in the admission requirements were to accommodate the differences in programs and the GPA requirements. The key change in the GPA is to eliminate the content GPA as a requirement for admission to the program. The responsibilities of TEAC were revised to monitor the content GPA's. It was noted that the Missouri Educator Profile (MEP) was removed as a requirement for admission. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Wall moved, seconded by Dr. Haughey, to approve the Change in TEAC Responsibilities. With the need to monitor content GPA's, it was felt that TEAC could handle this additional charge. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Wall moved, seconded by Dr. Farnan, to approve Proposal 218-62-01, Change in Program, M.S.Ed. in Special Education. Dr. Farnan explained that this aligns the entrance requirements with the other education master's programs. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Farnan moved to bundle Agenda Items 5-7. The motion was seconded by Dr. Smith and unanimously approved. Dr. Wall moved, seconded by Dr. Farnan, to approve the following:

- Proposal 218-61-10, Change in Program, B.S.Ed. for Secondary Programs (9-12)
- Proposal 218-61-11, Change in Program, B.S.Ed. for Elementary-Secondary Programs (K-12)

These proposals allow us to differentiate between the elementary, middle school, secondary and K-12 programs and address enrollment issues. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Wall moved to bundle Agenda Items 8-12. The motion was seconded by Dr. Smith and unanimously approved. Dr. Farnan moved, seconded by Ms. Miles, to approve the following:

The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Wall moved to bundle Proposals 218-CDR-04 and 218-CDR-06. The motion was seconded by Ms. Miles and unanimously approved. Dr. Haughey moved, seconded by Dr. Smith, to approve the following:

Proposal 218-CDR-06, Change in Program, Bachelor of Science in Education

The new nursing program was designed to be 120 hours, and the hour structure for degrees needs to be changed to accommodate the offering of this program. After discussion about potential implications for education-related programs currently at more than 120 credit hours, and possible MDHE and state motives to move to 120-hour programs, the motion was unanimously approved.

Director of Teacher Education Report

Dr. Wall expressed his appreciation to the undergraduate and graduate students on the Council for their service in 2017-2018, and congratulated them on graduation and successful defense of the Master's Portfolio. He reported that Dr. Malm has asked to be released of her duties as Assistant Director of Teacher Education so that she may return to full-time mathematics education, and offered to collaborate with the new Assistant Director of Teacher Education so as to enable a smooth transition as we prepare our self-study for national accreditation. Dr. Joseph Haughey will serve in this role as the new assistant director. Dr. Wall reported that our online professional programs are doing very well. Mike McBride will be attending the MoTAC meeting in Jefferson City tomorrow.
