P-12 School Representatives Reports/Updates

Tricia Knowles reported that Maryville is finishing their first quarter. The new performance art building is close to completion, and they are planning a grand opening on October 21. The district is looking at implementing Close Reading within the professional development umbrella.

Dr. Christensen moved to approve the minutes of the September 8, 2016, meeting. The motion was seconded by Dr. Zelif and unanimously approved.

Dr. Zelif moved, seconded by Dr. Malm, to approve the agenda. The motion was unanimously approved.

Dr. Malm moved, seconded by Dr. Christensen, to approve Proposal 116-43-01, Change in Program, Middle School Speech Theatre. The program is being increased from 21 to 24 hours to meet the new certification requirements. The motion was unanimously approved.

Ms. Creason moved, seconded by Dr. Malm, to approve Proposal 116-62-01, Approval of New Course, Special Topics in Education (62-503). This course was developed to expand opportunities to explore educational topics, especially study abroad opportunities. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Pippin moved, seconded by Dr. Malm, to approve Proposal 116-19-01, Change in Courses:

- 19-481 Methods in Elementary School Music—change in course description and title
- 19-592 General Music Methods—change in course description, title and prerequisite(s)

The motion was unanimously approved.

Ms. Creason moved, seconded by Ms. Smith, to approve Proposal 116-36-01, Change in Program, Middle School Social Science. The program is being increased from 21 to 24 hours to meet the new certification requirements. The motion was unanimously approved.


Director of Teacher Education Report
