P-12 School Representatives Reports/Updates

Mr. Eggers reported that they are still reviewing the MSIP 5 Proposed Performance Standards for K-12 districts.

Dr. Ingraham moved to approve the minutes of the November 11, 2010, meeting. The motion was seconded by Dr. Crossland and unanimously approved.

Dr. Ingraham moved, seconded by Mr. Hatfield, to approve the agenda. The motion was unanimously approved.

At our previous meeting, it was approved to reconsider Proposal 110-44-04, Change in Admission Requirements, M.S.Ed. in Teaching: Instructional Technology. Changes to the proposal included increasing the writing assessment to two pages and clarifications of the scoring. The first sentence of fourth item of the justification was struck. Dr. Zelif moved to accept this proposal with these changes. The motion was seconded by Dr. Glenn and unanimously approved.


Director of Teacher Education Report
