IMPORTANT NOTICE – Recital Attendance Policies

1. Recital slips are available prior to the beginning of each event. A member of the music faculty will be located at either the entrance to CJT or near the ticket booth in HMLA (or outside of main ballroom entrance if event is at this location) and will distribute and collect recital slips at each performance on this approved list.
2. Students must return their own recital slips immediately after each performance that they attend.
3. No recital slips will be accepted late unless accompanied by the verification of a music faculty member and permission of the Department Chair.
4. Students must fill out the actual recital slips - Facsimiles will not be accepted.
5. **If you arrive late for or leave early from any concert or recital performance, you will NOT be given a slip or allowed to turn one in, and no recital credit will be given.**
6. Due to the ever-increasing use of cell phones and other electronic devices, **effective immediately**, recital attendance credit may be revoked at the discretion of the music faculty for the use of such devices during recitals and concerts. This also includes text messaging. **JUST PUT THEM AWAY!** The purpose of the recital is to hear the performance. Please be respectful and courteous of the performers and other listeners.
7. Students performing in senior and music student recitals will be given credit automatically and do not have to obtain a recital slip. However, recital credit will NOT be given for performing in ensemble concerts.

Students enrolled in 19-201 Enjoyment of Music, 19-202 Jazz Appreciation, or 19-222 American Popular Music must consult their individual instructor for recital attendance requirements and evaluation.

Rationale:

The music curriculum is designed so that all majors perform in their major applied areas. Musicianship is also, however, promoted through listening. Much can be learned about the art of performing, and the large body of music literature through listening. This course provides the opportunity for students to be in the audience during concerts and recitals rather than on stage thereby gaining a better overall perspective of entire musical works.

Course Objectives:

1. To help students learn a broad scope of musical literature.
2. To develop listening skills that enable students to develop a high standard of musical expectation. (Educational Key Quality Indicator: Critical/Creative Thinking Competencies).
3. To acquaint students with major composers and the major compositions from the world's music in a variety of settings. (Educational Key Quality Indicator: Cultural Enrichment).

Content:

A variety of approved recitals and concerts will be provided at the beginning of the term.

Instructional Methods and Techniques:

The experience the student gains from listening is the only method of instruction.

Textbook Information:

There is no textbook for this course

Grading Scale:

1. **Music majors must attend 12 programs** from the approved list per term. B.M.E. majors must successfully complete 7 trimesters of 19-299 while B.A. majors must successfully complete 8 trimesters.
2. **Part-time music majors and music minors must attend 8 programs** from the approved list per term. Par-time music students and music minors must complete four trimesters of 19-299
3. Students must attend the minimum number of events for their degree programs in order to receive a passing grade ('A'). Attendance below requirements above will result in failure ('F'). If the course is failed, it must be repeated in order to get credit for having taken it.

Attendance Policy:
