Nothing to report. President Voss asked Ms. Barcus to discuss the compensation task force. The task force is asked to take a report to the BOR and the president. Due to this, they moved a meeting back and will be meeting March 31st and inviting the President.  1. Handouts
 - President Voss discussed the proposed reorganization of faculty Senate and the reporting line. A handout was attached to the meeting invite for faculty senators to review. Senators had the following questions.
 - Question: a senator stated that parliamentarian was not on the chart, but it is considered in the officers. It was discussed that parliamentarian is still listed with the officers.
 - Question: Tenure needed for upper level of senate – does the research committee need tenure for that role? It can be challenging to fill with tenured faculty for some positions. A short discussion occurred regarding this.
 - Question: A senator asked if there would be committees under the main committees. Yes. There would be a reporting line up and this process will speed up the larger senate meetings. The main committee would be the reporting line at faculty senate. The committees under the main committee would only report to the main committee.
 - Question: A senator asked about the distribution. Will it change the number of faculty on the committees. It should not change the number of faculty on a committee. This restructures items for reporting purposes.
 - Question: A senator asked if this was sent to the Provost. President Voss stated that he has not presented this to the Provost, but will discuss it with her after Spring Break. This is under the bylaws. Nothing is under the constitutional level. Dr. Adam stated that the integrity panel does report to the provost.
 - A senator inquired if committee chairs on the “main” committee would serve on the committees beneath them. President Voss stated no, that is not the intension with the possible exception of

IRB and Animal Welfare Committees. More discussion needs to occur.

-Additional discussions occurred regarding reporting lines and reporting to the provost. President Voss will communicate more with the Faculty Senate Executive committee and the provost regarding these questions.

-President Voss inquired if there were thoughts about University Seminar being removed from a main level? No concerns were present from faculty senators.
