- **Call to Order**

- President Miller called the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m.

- **Approval of Agenda Motion by Senator Olson/seconded by Senator Adam**

- The agenda was approved unanimously.

- **Reports:**

- **Provost Report (Dr. Hooyman)**

- Dr. Hooyman's report was given by Dr. Tapps in her absence.

- Currently, there are not enough legislative details to provide information regarding performance funding, but faculty should be advised that funding will be discussed in the legislative session.

- Dr. Hooyman's retirement reception is from 10 am-12 pm on Friday, December 5.

- The Administration Building moves have begun, and all of the academic leadership has been moved to Owens Library.



- **Human Resources (Krista Barcus)**

- VP Barcus reported that the HR office will be moving into one of the temporary office buildings. Faculty should email or call before they come to the office to get the exact location in the temporary buildings.

- VP Barcus answered a question from a Senator about the pay schedule moving to every two weeks. She indicated that nothing will change until July 1 of 2026.

- VP Barcus answered a question from a Senator about the communication related to pay adjustments from the compensation study. She indicated that the communications are in the final discussions on cost and budget, but that those communications will go out before January 1. There will be a standard communication

to say that Phase 1 of the compensation plan has been implemented, and those impacted will be notified individually.

- **Chief Amanda Cullin**
 - Chief Cullin brought Lt. Marcus Holmes and introduced him to the senators. Chief Cullin reported that UPD will be going through the policy and procedures manual this summer and asked for any advice and input from faculty, and will put out information regarding opportunities for input.
- **Associate Provost, Academic Operations and Assessment (Dr. Tapps)**
 - AP Tapps reported on the research data integrity policy. In the Canvas site, there is an ethical use of data module. It is best practice to have all faculty members added to the Canvas site so that all faculty have access to data usage best practices. CITI training is still required, but this is an additional resource for faculty conducting research.
 - The Canvas site will be up for faculty as soon as it is approved.
- **Director of Student Accommodations and Accessibility (Mackenzie Campbell, joined by Dr. Stephanie Krauth and Dr. Elise Hepworth.**

- **Senate President (Dr. Miller)**
 - Faculty Senate Report to the Board of Regents
 - Next Thursday, December 11, I will present the Faculty Senate's report to the Board of Regents. Although I will include research accomplishments, my primary focus will be on the meaningful contributions our faculty make through:
 - Student engagement – internships, independent studies, directed research, invited speakers, demonstrations, student travel, and other forms of high-impact learning.
 - Community involvement – work that supports Maryville, Nodaway County, the state of Missouri, and our broader regional partners.
 - Disciplinary contributions – professional activity that strengthens our programs and enhances the reputation of the university.
 - I ask each of you to forward any accomplishments or contributions you believe should be highlighted. I will be reaching out to Deans and School Chairs with this same request.
 - Elections for Faculty Senators for 2025–2026
 - This spring, we will return fully to our regular Faculty Senate election cycle. As you recall, this past August,

faculty elected two Senators and two Alternates from each college—some to one-year terms and others to two-year terms—to reestablish an appropriate rotation of representation.

- During the upcoming spring election cycle, all Senators and Alternates who were elected to one-year terms will need to be replaced or reelected, with all new terms moving to the standard two-year duration.
- We will also need to elect Senators and Alternates from several schools. The following positions must be filled...
 - Agricultural Sciences – Senator (current Senator eligible for reelection)
 - Business – Senator and Alternate (both eligible for reelection)
 - Computer Science – Senator and Alternate (current Senator *not* eligible; current Alternate eligible for reelection)
 - Fine and Performing Arts – Senator (current Senator *not* eligible for reelection)
 - Language, Literature, and Writing – Senator and Alternate (both eligible for reelection)
 - Mathematics and Statistics – Senator and Alternate (both eligible for reelection)

 - Senator Olson reported that the Academic Integrity Panel met on December 1 and reviewed 13 cases. The committee also initiated a review of the Academic Integrity Policy to clarify procedures specified in the policy, as requested by the Provost, and that the Academic Petitions Committee meets on December 4.

 - DCM- The committee met on November 20, and Dr. Hepworth attended the meeting to discuss the alignment of Northwest Core with Core 42, and that DCM should have clearer oversight for the general education curriculum. DCM committee members will talk to schools about the alignment and ‘double counting’ of classes in the core, as well as providing more classes to be part of the core.
 - Graduate Council- The committee will meet again on December 8.
 - CDR- The committee met on November 18, and 31 proposals were reviewed.
