Formal Recruitment Recap

Recent record numbers for Panhellenic and IFC

This fall provided an exciting formal recruitment process for both IFC and Panhellenic, showing recent highs all around. For the second year in a row, formal recruitment concluded after Labor Day, with Bid Day falling on September 8th. Approximately 31% of freshmen women and 24% of freshmen men signed up for recruitment, with 134 women and 74 men accepting bids. For IFC, that was the second-highest number in seven years. For Panhellenic, the percentage of PNMs both registered and who accepted bids was the highest seen in the past six years. This year was the first time in four years that FSL grew both in headcount and percentage of students. We are very grateful for all of the work the active members put into growing our community, and we can't wait to see what impact these new members have!
