# STUDY ABROAD

## THROUGH NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY

Study Abroad provides students the opportunity to participate in academic programs outside the United States that will increase their awareness of and sensitivity to other cultures in the context of their chosen discipline. Whether a longer-term immersion program or short-term faculty-led course, students will enhance their understanding of themselves, their academic curriculum, their communities and the world through direct contact with the people, languages and traditions in another country or region. Study Abroad challenges students to enrich their vocational opportunities and develop the necessary skills for personal, professional and inter-cultural interaction in an interdependent world.



### STUDY ABROAD 101:

- Students pay tuition and fees to either Northwest or the partner institution abroad
- Program length options: semester, summer, year-long and faculty-led programs

### WILL MY CREDITS TRANSFER?

- YES! Study Abroad courses are approved prior to departure
- 12 credits required for fall and spring; 6 credits for summer
- Studying abroad should not delay your graduation

### WHAT KIND OF CLASSES MAY I TAKE?

- Major, minor or Northwest Core courses
- Most study abroad programs are taught in English

### WHERE WILL I LIVE?

- Different universities offer different options
  - On-campus dorms
  - Off-campus apartments
  - Homestays
- The partner institution or program abroad arranges student accommodations prior to arrival

### DO I HAVE TO GO ALONE?

- Study with fellow Bearcats and be taught by Northwest faculty
- With other US students and international students

### HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

- Cost varies by program
- Many programs are comparable to Northwest Tuition, Room and Board
- Your financial aid and scholarships may apply depending on the program you choose and the conditions of your financial aid

### WHERE CAN I GO?

- Our programs include more than 240 universities in 50 countries
- If you do not speak a second language, do not worry; most programs are taught in English.

### TO STUDY ABROAD AT NORTHWEST YOU MUST:

- Completed two semesters at Northwest or be a transfer with sophomore status
- Have a grade-point average of 2.5
- Explore your options on the Study Abroad website and meet with an advisor in the International Involvement Center



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
