BEARCAT HEALTH & WELLNESS TIP



EXTREME HEAT

Be prepared and aware - extremely hot weather can cause sickness or even death. The following tips will keep you safe at work and prepared at home this summer.

IT'S HOT OUTSIDE

STAY COOL: Stay in air-conditioned buildings as much as possible and avoid direct sunlight.

STAY HYDRATED: Drink plenty of water and don't wait until you're thirsty to drink.

STAY INFORMED: Stay updated on local weather forecasts so you can plan activities safely during extreme temperatures.

KNOW THE SIGNS

HEAT EXHAUSTION

- Heavy Sweating
- Weakness
- Cold, pale clammy skin
- Fast, weak pulse
- Nausea or vomiting
- Fainting

HEAT STROKE

- High body temperature (above 103 degrees)
- Hot, dry or moist skin
- Rapid and strong pulse
- Possible unconsciousness

If you work outdoors or supervise staff that do, the following tips will keep you prepared and aware:

- Drink two to four cups of water every hour while working
- Don't wait until you are thirsty to drink.
- Avoid alcohol or liquids containing large amounts of sugar.
- Pace yourself while working
- Take short breaks (every two hours is highly recommended).
- Wear and reapply sunscreen as indicated on the package.

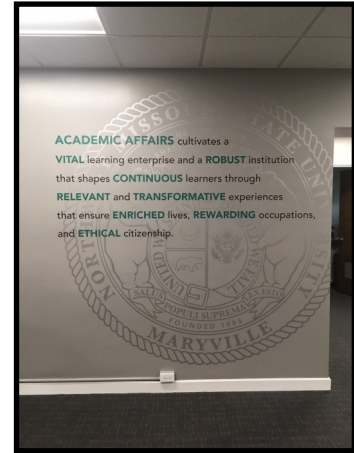

FACILITIES HISTORY

- July 1926 - The curved road from 4th Street into campus was put in along with the fountain.
- July 8, 1938 - Northwest is notified that the US government will assume 45% of the cost of building a library.
- July 9, 1911 - City water is cut off from the Normal School. The school uses water from a well west of the Admin Building, and residents are forbidden from watering their horses at the well.
- July 21, 1949 - The school's name is changed to Northwest Missouri State College.
- July 22, 1890 - The cornerstone of the "Old Seminary Building" is laid.
- July 24, 1979 - The Admin Building fire devastates the campus's central building.
- July 26, 2010 - The Admin Building is added to the National Register of Historic Places.
- July 27, 1911 - Students see the first "talking picture" at the Fern Theater.
- July 29, 2004 - Northwest's football stadium formally known as Rickenbrode Stadium is renamed Bearcat Stadium.
- July 30, 1954 - The first commencement at Memorial Stadium is conducted at 8 p.m.
- July 31, 1966 - The Wormy World restaurant opens for one night only in the Horace Mann fourth-level classroom. The night's menu included wormy casserole and chili con worme.

Employees and students may register their vehicle by following these steps:

- [Log in to CatPAWS](#).
- Click the Personal Information tab
- Click Parking Permit Registration
- Click "Proceed to register your vehicle" and follow the remaining steps

After completing the registration, you may pick up your parking permit at the Cashiering Office on the first floor of the Administration Building. A photo identification is required to pick up your permit.
